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Filial Confidence in Our Lady

The starting point of a lively devotion to Her

A lively devotion to Our Lady usually begins when help is received from her, giving birth to confidence in the soul. Generally speaking, those I have met who have a true devotion to Our Lady began with some help or support from Our Lady to the person.

The person is in trouble—sometimes spiritually, sometimes materially, or something else—and turns to Our Lady for help. Our Lady saves him from those difficulties but does more. She brings something to his soul in the order of imponderables and grace whereby he experiences her maternal, smiling, and kind goodness. He has a lively hope that she will come to his aid again in other difficult circumstances. The continuous pleading for all kinds of graces—most of all for the love of God, which is the grace we should pray for the most—develops in a way that Our Lady becomes ever more exorable, maternal, and her assistance more meticulous, as the person grows in this experience of the kind and smiling providence she endows on him.

People often find themselves asking Our Lady's help for real trifles, little

insignificant things. She will grant them because she is a mother who likes to give her children things great and small and who smiles with special tenderness when she is asked for “unimportant” things.

Here we see a prime example of confidence, a dawning of the true understanding of our relationship with Our Lady. Even if the soul may have to pass very long and tough trials and periods of dryness and difficulties, something of that confidence remains. It accompanies the person throughout his life like a constant light, also in the last and most bitter throes of death.

I would highly recommend that you at least ask from Our Lady the grace to grant some concessions and put you on this special way, full of love and gentleness, where you live in a sort of intimacy with her and can ask her for these personal small requests and favours. Sometimes she will even do the following: when we

ask her for something which she is not planning to grant because we are supposed to pass this trial, and Our Lady wishes it to be this way—well, Our Lady will not give us what we asked for, but she will strengthen us to bear what is to come. This will turn out to be much bigger than expected, and when everything is over, she will grant something better than what we requested.

Medieval legends present the real aspect of Our Lady

Medieval devotional books and legends—some of which are real, others imagined but all enjoyable and interesting—on devotion to Our Lady in that golden age, show Mary Most Holy's special grace and kindness in the handling of souls. It does not matter whether the



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story is true regarding the persons who play a role in it; what is important is the real aspect of Our Lady it shows. Even though they are only legends, they are theological and Marian and let us “feel” very well how Our Lady is.

I remember an episode told in the book of St. Alphonsus Liguori, *The Glories of Mary*. A man in the Middle Ages had a strong desire to see Our Lady and would have given everything to look at her, even if it would mean that he had to go blind. He had an inspiration, or an angel came and let him know that if he accepted to become blind for the rest of his life, he would be granted the grace of seeing Our Lady. The man accepted. Our Lady appeared to him in radiant beauty and tremendously kind, regal, and full of affection, and he was ecstatic. When the vision faded, he found that he was blind in only one eye. However, he still felt such longing for Our Lady that he made a new request and was asked again: “Do you consent to become blind in the other eye?” He hesitated a little . . . but then said, “I do. I want so much to see her again that I agree to become blind in the other eye!” Thus, Our Lady appeared again and spoke to him; and when the vision went away, he could see perfectly well with both eyes!

I do not need to know whether this story occurred because I know that this is how Our Lady is! In other words, she can let us go through dire straits to test our love and take away the sight of one of our eyes or allow that we experience some anguish, but in the end, we see her smile. We may have to go through the necessary trials, but everything ends with a smile of hers.



Another much better-known story, and many of you probably remember it—still I enjoy telling it here—is about the famous juggler of Our Lady. He was a man who was an artist in juggling; the only thing he knew how to do well was to juggle with five wooden balls in his hands or something of the sort. Wishing to please Our Lady and not knowing anything else, he went to a church at a time when no one was there and presented his juggling act to her; and Our Lady appeared to him and smiled to show how pleased she was.

The same works for us: When we present our offerings to Our Lady, insignificant as they may seem, we must offer

them trusting that she will be pleased.

If we fail to do so, our devotion to her will never be entirely truthful. We must have a natural ease and intimacy with Our Lady, like a child, who, even when he saddens her, comes to her, fully confident that he can still count on her help and smile. This is the unspeakably gentle starting point of a vivid devotion to Our Lady.

I am not saying that this is it. A person must study, to the degree that his intellectual resources allow it, the fundamentals of the devotion to Our Lady and have them reasoned. He must have them reinforced to form a deep certainty based on Catholic dogma. Still, intellectual formation is one thing, and the life of devotion is another; both complete each other. They form a wonderful unity! It shows us why such a great Doctor of the Church as St. Alphonsus Liguori wrote his book, *The Glories of Mary*, illustrating several doctrinal theses together with concrete facts.

Thus, as we prepare tonight for the novena of Our Lady Help of Christians—we who pray to her daily and have her statue in our chapel—it is good that we remember this. We do well to ask for that grace of special tenderness in our devotion to her, a flower of Catholicism.

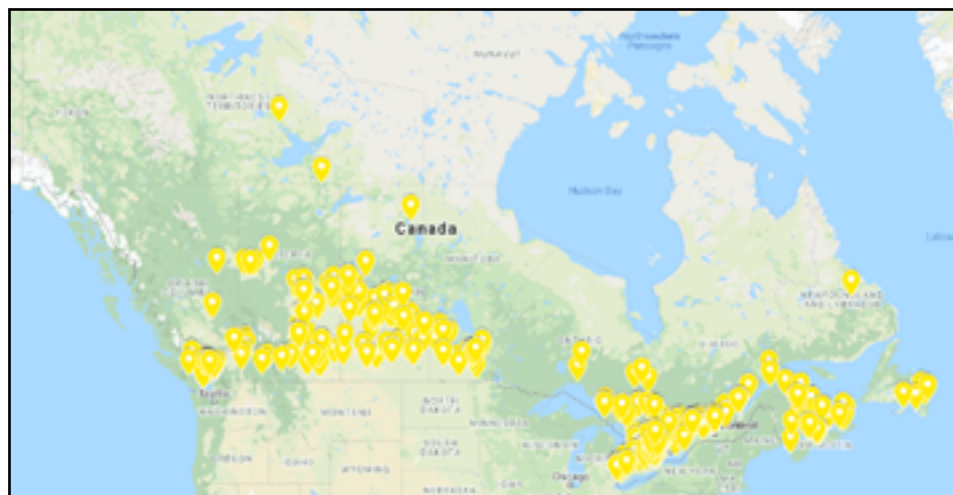
